- Understand the rules governing Succession, Marriage, and maintenance
- Understand the laws governing testamentary succession in India

## III Semester:

### Course-I Environmental Law

- To have basic understanding of the environmental issues and their relationship with law
- To understand the importance of inter-generational equity and sustainable development
- To understand the important principles viz. Polluter should pay principle, Public trust doctrine, and precautionary principles
- To understand important legislations governing environment protection
- To be familiar with the constitutional dimensions regarding wholesome environment as a fundamental right

### Course-II Labour Law

- Acquaint with the Industrial relations framework in the country
- Understand the importance of maintenance of industrial peace



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- Understand the kinds of industrial disputes and modes of peaceful settlement of industrial disputes
- To acquire working knowledge of the operation of various labour welfare legislation viz. Trade Union Act 1926, Payment of wages Act, Minimum wages Act, Workman's Compensation Act, Factories act, ESI Act 1948, Employees provident fund Act 1952
- Working knowledge about the operation of Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 and laws governing the disciplinary enquiry for misconduct
- To understand concept of social security, its importance and also constitutional basis for the same in India

## **Course-III Criminal Law-II: Criminal Procedure Code, JJ Act & Probation of Offenders Act**

- To be familiar with the pre-trial, trial and subsequent stages of criminal proceedings
- To understand the organizational structure, powers, functions of different authorities established under Criminal Procedure Code
- To get familiarity with the pleadings of the criminal proceedings
- To get familiarity with important documents of criminal proceedings viz. FIR, Police statement, Charge sheet etc.
- To get working knowledge of Juvenile Justice Act and Probation of offenders Act

## **Course-IV Jurisprudence**

- To develop the skill of critical thinking
- To understand the social, political and theoretical context of law
- To critically analyze and try to find answers to fundamental question in the legal philosophy viz. What is law? What are the purposes of law? What is the relationship between law, morality and justice?
- To understand various theories of law and schools of jurisprudence
- To understand the sources of law their nature, significance
- To be familiar with the theoretical background of fundamental legal concepts viz. Rights, Duties, Possession, Ownership, Liability, Power, obligations, person etc.
